Vale Peg Wilson—74 years young

Peg had a swimming career spanning 70 years and won her first swimming race at age 8 years. In 1954, Peg was 16 and living at West Wyalong where she won every distance and stroke in her age division. She was noticed and went off to train with the Frank Guthrie Team at North Sydney Pool, meeting her hardest rival – Dawn Fraser.

“She was always better than me, but I could hold her for 30 metres in a 50 metre sprint, but I still hold the record for the most rides on the Big Dipper at Luna Park”.

In 1956 a return to West Wyalong and teaching swimming here and Cootamundra.

Family and travel were a focus but in 1973 a move to Tamworth brought Peg back to competitive swimming with the formation of the Tamworth AUSSI club.

As an AUSSI Masters swimmer, in one year she held the fastest time record in her age group in every event. Peg was President of Tamworth AUSSI for 14 years, as well as State President.

Highlights:

- Peg won the Australian Marathon Championship
- Narrabeen Lake Swim – 3 times
- Lake Macquarie and Port Stephens swims
- World Masters
- First official crossing of Lake Keepit, January 1977 – a distance of 9.6 km in around 3 hours
- Peg wanted to be the first grandmother to swim the English Channel but other events halted it
- Peg’s relentless drive to improve infrastructure at Tamworth Pools, including access ramps, steps because “Wee Waa had it. Why don’t we in Tamworth?”

- Charity swimming carnivals for cancer and WESTPAC Rescue Helicopter
- Set 5 national records for her age in her 50s and 60s and about a dozen state records.

Special requests and quotes from the great lady herself:

- “I sure taught a lot of people to swim”.
- “Breathe / Blow. Breathe / Blow”.
- She was so proud of all her grandchildren, especially in the pool and recently Emily Grellman being selected in the Australian Under 16 Water Polo squad to tour New Zealand in June.
- Peg loved swimming at Scully Park Tamworth. She would always ask to be taken to the pool and once said she hoped her days on earth ended in the pool at Scully, much to the horror of Cameron, as he would have a mountain of paperwork and many “please explains”!

Personal note: Trent Owen

- “Peg taught me to swim at the famous backyard pool in Upper Street, Tamworth
- I was constantly getting in trouble for being on the bottom of the pool with Peg always saying “Don’t worry, he’s got to come up for air sometime!”
- Peg said – “I got a lot of pleasure knowing they could save themselves in the water”
- I made a career of it!

added to a "World's NSW Bushranger Mailing list" and kept up-to-date on the status of the relays entered. (Please enter and notify Christina by March 31 to allow time to enter the relays).

4. Volunteer on 2 potential ideas...

Social: Organise a NSW Bushrangers team dinner during World's.

Equipment: Design, take orders, and distribute team equipment (e.g. caps, t-shirts, water bottles, etc).

5. Stay tuned on further updates.

***Note: If you prefer to create relays only from your own club and want to be recorded as your local club, then do not join Bushrangers. However, on the international scene, it makes a far better impression to attend as one State club.*

With this approach, we hope to represent as one at World's and show the strength of the NSW swimming community on the international stage!

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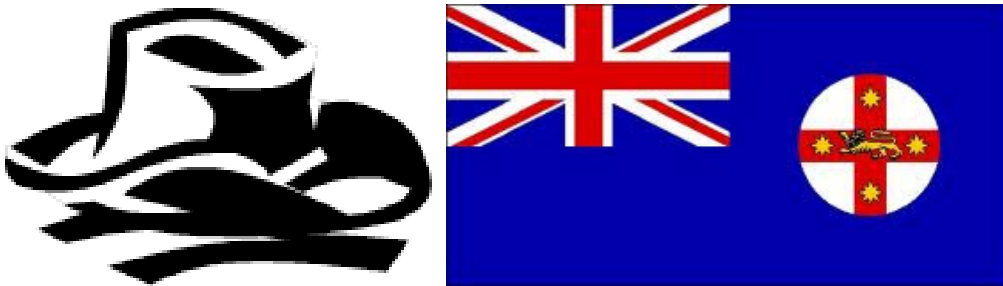

Training Coordinator's Report

In 2012 MSNSW will conduct 20 Branch Point Score swim meets plus championships. On the average each swim meet needs 16 officials to conduct a successful professional swim meet. Branch, National and World records can be broken at any of these swim meets. Not only does the pool have to be surveyed for the correct size you also need to have the correct quantity of accredited officials. This means in 2012 MSNSW will need the assistance of 320 officials. Based on last year's figures only 77 officials were utilised. There are another 123 officials on the MSNSW Officials List that is sent to clubs for selecting officials for their swim meet. My question is where and why are the other 46 qualified officials not being utilised. Please, if you are an official and not receiving any offers to officiate and wish to officiate at MSNSW swim meets talk to the clubs who have swim meets coming up and offer your services. This needs to be done 12 – 14 weeks before the swim meet date. It may take a few offers before you hit the jackpot. Organisers of swim meets please give these officials a go. Unfortunately the 77 hard working officials are all getting older and there are few younger ones coming along to replace us.

So that MSNSW can remain a strong swimming movement we need younger members to take on the enjoyable challenge of officiating.

Please email or phone DiP of your intention to attend a course. Once you have completed your competencies you need to officiate in those positions a few times as a qualified official to gain experience before continuing on to the next official course. Remember one course at a time. Please refer to the table below for your eligibility to attend your chosen course.

Technical Matters

COMPETITIONS

Recent competitions and the January Officials Workshop, have highlighted several matters needing attention by clubs, officials, coaches and swimmers. The most pressing is relay-teams, and this is addressed in a separate article in this issue titled "Relay Teams". The other matters are:

- Warm-up/swim down during competition
- Checking swimmers' names
- Chief Timekeepers
- Double-Arm Backstroke flip-turn
- Breaststroke and Butterfly touches.

Warm-up/swim down during competition

Please be aware that if only one lane is available during competition, that you must not do a dive entry to the pool. To avoid accidents and undue disturbance to swimmers who are racing, you may only swim freestyle or breaststroke. Drills, backstroke and butterfly are not allowed.

Checking swimmers, names

Timekeepers or other officials may ask you your name either before the start of an event or when you have finished swimming. Please be civil to them as they are doing this to ensure your correct time is recorded to you, not to someone who has slipped into your dedicated lane by mistake.

Chief Timekeepers

Please be aware that it is often difficult for the referee to identify you especially in the 50m events (in 50m pools). You can help by wearing a fluoro vest or bringing your own clipboard with a fluoro back for better visibility.

Double-Arm Backstroke flip-turn

The rule governing backstroke turns is SW 6.4 and of particular importance are the MSA clarifications to the rule. This rule has changed several times in the past 10 years but the current rule does not require the swimmer:

1. to do a somersault after turning over the vertical to the breast;
2. to do a continuous single arm pull or a continuous double arm pull.

It is MSA's view that these changes were made to allow for the swimmer who turns over too close to the wall and is forced to grab or touch the wall.

The second clarification states that kicking of the

legs on the breast is allowed if it is part of the turning action. This means that double-arm backstrokers who wish to turn onto the breast and grab or touch the wall must time their turn onto the breast so they do not kick before they commence to move their arms. Naturally they must touch the wall with some part of their body (e.g. the hands) before pushing off on their back.

Breaststroke touches

Breaststroke rule SW 7.2 specifies a cycle of one arm stroke followed by one leg kick from the start and throughout the race. SW 7.3 states that the "hands shall be pushed forward together from the breast on, under, or over the water".

This means that swimmers cannot follow their last arm pull with a second little arm pull or if almost at the end wall when they complete a kick with a second kick. On their last stroke they can lunge at the wall so their elbows may break the surface in order to make the touch, which can be made with the finger tips.

Butterfly touches

Rule SW 8.2M specifies that "both arms must be brought forward over the water... throughout the race." This means that if the arms fall just short of the end wall the swimmer cannot do a little scull stroke to touch. They can either kick in, glide in, or do an extra complete stroke, depending on how far they are from the end wall.

Relays are not only fun to swim in, they are very important to clubs because double points are awarded for each place in each age group.

At recent meets a few relay teams have had to be disqualified because they did not follow the rules. The National rules for relays can be found at **SW 10 The Race** in the MSA Swimming Rules (see www.mastersswimming.org.au/Rules).

RELAY TEAMS

At most meets you must nominate the number of relay teams you want to enter along with your individual entries. You will not have to name the swimmers until the day of the meet (to allow for sickness and other absences).

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Swimmers must be registered and financial by the closing date for the swim meet for their team to be eligible to score BPS points.

It is essential that the person responsible for entering relays on the day of the swim arrives at the pool with a list of:

- all club members who have entered, including their names;
- age in whole years at 31/12/yyyy, (2012 this year);
- sex, and if possible;
- times for the strokes and distances to be swum.

Relay teams have 4 swimmers unless the program states otherwise. There are three categories of teams:

- Womens: four women
- Mens: four men; and
- Mixed: two women plus two men (in no set order of sex).

In BPS meets each swimmer may swim only once in

each relay event. For example, in a 4 x 50m freestyle relay, a swimmer may swim in a women's team (or a men's team as the case may be) or a mixed team, but NOT in BOTH a women's team (or men's team) and a mixed team.

The age group of a team is determined by adding their four ages in whole years as at 31/12/yyyy. Part years cannot be included in the total.

The relay entry form must be completed and checked to ensure all details are correct.

Swimmers must swim in the order that their name appears on their entry (see Rule SW 10.13M) and **swimmers cannot be substituted without permission** (see SW 10.12M). Failure to comply with the rules will result in disqualification of the team and no points being awarded.
