It is a simple process to renew your coaching qualifications.

You need to create a new log on the DITA platform where the Coaching Course and Reaccreditation sit. At the moment MSA is in the process of adding all coaches to this site, with automatic notifications eventually being generated from this platform.

Don't let your qualification lapse – it is easy to reaccredit.

Club Coach Course

The online Club Coach Course is an excellent accessible way for people keen to become a qualified Masters Coach. https://mastersswimming.org.au/become-a-club-coach/

Please encourage your club members to gain this accreditation if they are keen to coach. By 2024, it will be a requirement for Masters Coaches to be qualified, as unqualified coaches will not be covered by MSA insurance.

Call for nominations 2022 Coach of the Year

MSNSW is seeking nominations for 2022 Coach of the Year award. Is there a coach in your club who has been a motivating and inspiring influence even through this COVID year? **Nominations close 14 January 2023**

Coaches at all levels within Masters Swimming are eligible. Coach of the Year may be a high-profile coach with elite competition level squads and high-performance swimmers. Other equally committed and skilled coaches make very significant contributions/applications in different ways to masters swimming. The selection panel makes their decision based on the overall merits of the individual nominees.

To be eligible for consideration the nominee should:

- be a current Masters Swimming Australia Member and have been a member from 01 January
- hold a current Masters Swimming Australia Coaching Accreditation or equivalent
- have been actively coaching Masters swimmers (detail position in club and coaching hours/week);
- have made an outstanding contribution in coaching and/or towards the development of coaching and promotion of Masters Swimming at Club, Branch and/or National level;
- have undertaken professional development opportunities to improve their coaching skills and/or presented at coaching courses, workshops or clinics;
- have demonstrated a proven capacity to improve the level of performance of Masters Swimmers (i.e. improvement in times, placings at Branch/National and/or International events, technique development, ability for swimmers to complete a greater distance and/or achievement of a higher level of fitness);
- have practised and espoused a philosophy of fair play and promoted the values of Masters Swimming e.g. acceptance, consideration & respect for all participants; Coaches who have implemented innovative ideas to improve coaching and/or undertaken extra-curricular activities relevant to coaching above the minimum level expected of a Masters Swimming Coach will be viewed favourably.

Call for nominations 2022 Official of the Year

MSNSW is seeking nominations for 2022 Official of the Year award.

To be eligible for consideration, nominees must be an accredited Masters Swimming Technical Official, be a current member from 01 January and must have made an outstanding contribution in officiating and/or towards the development of officiating at Club, Branch and/or National level. For example:

Attended courses to enhance knowledge and interpretation of rules; Delivered courses to prospective officials;

Taken the position of mentor to trainee officials. The Official of the Year should be an individual who has achieved excellence as a technical official. Implementation of innovative ideas to improve officiating and extra activities related to officiating, such as leadership, accreditation and professionalism will also be considered.

Nominations must be received by the Branch Office no later than 14 January to be eligible for consideration.

Please note there is an entry fee to be paid on entry to the pool when you arrive.



Pittwater Ocean Swim Series



It's On Again! – An Ocean Swim every Sunday in January with the popular Pittwater Ocean Swim Series

Yes, it's on again! The Pittwater Ocean Swim Series will feature ocean swims, every Sunday in January, showcasing some of Australia's most picturesque locations on Sydney's Northern Beaches.

The Newport Pool to Peak swims will kick off the Series on Sunday 8 January and ocean swimmers are expected to gleefully hit the waves in the post-covid era. Bilgola will follow on Sunday 15 January, Mona Vale on the 22nd, and the Big Swim on 29 January. Avalon will follow on Sunday 12 March.

"After the last couple of years with lockdowns etc, we are all wanting to get back into it and ocean swimming is a popular way to reconnect with nature. The Pittwater Series was created by the clubs involved as we were already cooperating with water safety and other organisational issues.

"The Pittwater Series has become very popular because it offers ocean swimmers, from around Australia and the rest of the world, a smorgasbord of well organised shorter and traditional swim courses in a great environment. Swimmers and their teams can enjoy the local cafes and restaurants as well as boutique shopping, said John Guthrie one of the Pittwater Series organisers.

Another Series organiser, David Madew from the Bilgola club, says the swims are an important fund raiser, for essential safety equipment and maintenance, benefitting the whole community.

"There is a terrific atmosphere at each swim and there is a lot of camaraderie between the experienced swimmers. The shorter swims also offer an opportunity for those who would like to try ocean swimming in a well supervised environment. It's a great challenge and we all know the health benefits of aerobic in the ocean.

"We are very appreciative of a grant, from Northern Beaches for the Series, which obviously recognises the importance of the events to the local business communities and tourism. After each swim we see swimmers and their teams enjoying the local cafes, clubs and shops," David said.

"Thanks to Oceanfit, the centre for ocean swimming in Australia, entrants to the Pittwater Ocean Swim Series will go into the draw for an Oceanfit swim The Whitsundays Tour, valued at \$1,995 for one, if they enter at least three of the swims. Entrants must be over 18 years and accommodation is in a single share cabin.

It's a draw of all swim entrants regardless of their swim time, which means even a dog paddler could win it! David continued
